

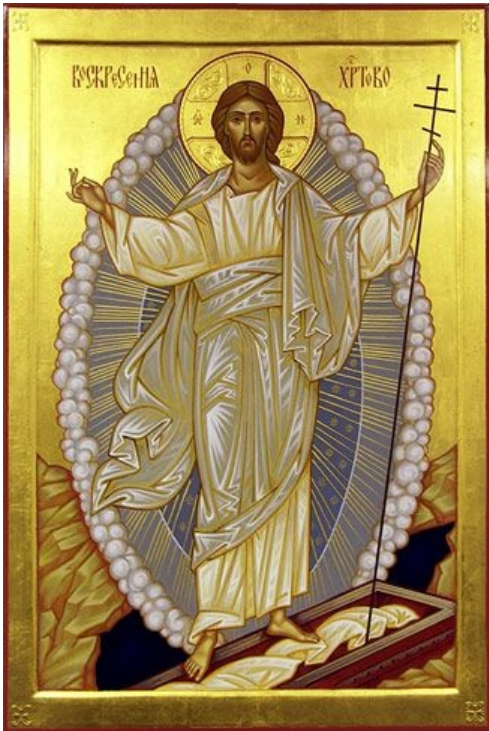

The Easter Gospel

**Alleluia! Christ our passover
has been sacrificed for us;
let us celebrate the feast then, in the Lord. Alleluia!**

28:¹ After the sabbath, as the first day of the week was dawning, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to see the tomb. ² And suddenly there was a great earthquake; for an angel of the Lord, descending from heaven, came and rolled back the stone and sat on it. ³ His appearance was like lightning, and his clothing white as snow. ⁴ For fear of him the guards shook and became like dead men. ⁵ But the angel said to the women, 'Do not be afraid; I know that you are looking for Jesus who was crucified. ⁶ He is not here; for he has been raised, as he said. Come, see the place where he lay. ⁷ Then go quickly and tell his disciples, "He has been raised from the dead, and indeed he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him." This is my message for you.' ⁸ So they left the tomb quickly with fear and great joy, and ran to tell his disciples. ⁹ Suddenly Jesus met them and said, 'Greetings!' And they came to him, took hold of his feet, and worshipped him. ¹⁰ Then Jesus said to them, 'Do not be afraid; go and tell my brothers to go to Galilee; there they will see me.'

A message of Easter hope in the midst of confusion.

It is an Easter unlike any other. The cry of victory still rises from the church, **Alleluia! Christ is risen**, but his Easter people are dispersed, church buildings empty and echoing. Not even in the dark days of the Medieval plagues were church buildings shut and public worship suspended.

The earthquake that is Covid-19 has shaken us all, but the message of the angels to the women who went to Jesus' tomb is maybe more powerful today. **'Do not be afraid; I know that you are looking for Jesus who was crucified. He is not here; for he has been raised, as he said'**.

The disciples were disorientated that first Easter Day. Nothing made sense, and they were about to enter a new normal. A new normal that would transform the world and our human view of life and death. Do not fear. Hope has not died. Love has not been extinguished. Jesus is alive!

For the time being, we are like those disciples, hidden behind the locked doors of the upper room, most of us from necessity rather than fear, though I know that for many fear lurks in the background. The message from the upper room is that the hidden church still functions, still prays, still meets with the risen Lord and is taught and nourished by him.

The day will come when we will be released from the upper room of isolation. When once again we will be freed to proclaim afresh the Risen Christ in the power of the Holy Spirit.

That day will most likely come at different times from different groups and ages, but it will come. Until then we are called like the disciples to watch and wait, to listen and to pray, and shout out in our own homes the Easter greeting.

**Alleluia! Christ is risen.
He is risen indeed. Alleluia!**

The prayer that follows is for all of us, but especially those watching the facebook Easter Eucharist this week.

EASTER *We give thanks that God has raised Jesus Christ from the dead, proclaiming his victory over evil, sin and death through the cross.*

EASTER MONDAY Acts 2:14-33, Matthew 28:8-15
